

# Data Protection Officer (DPO)

Under the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) public authorities must appoint a DPO.

The DPO should have professional experience and knowledge of data protection law proportionate to the type of processing that the organisation carries out.

The DPO's minimum tasks are:

- To inform and advise the organisation and its employees about their obligations to comply with the GDPR and other data protection laws
- To monitor compliance with the GDPR and other data protection laws, including managing internal data protection activities, advise on data protection impact assessments; train staff and conduct internal audits
- To be the first point of contact for supervisory authorities and for individuals whose data is processed (employees, customers, patients, service users etc.)
